

The Staircase – a CPD Event Presented by the Scottish Criminal Bar Association

The Event: A talk from David Rudolf for members of the legal profession only, and thereafter a Q&A session with him. The event also includes a drinks reception and is accredited by the Faculty for 1-hour substantive law CPD.

What it is about: The talk is by David Rudolf, the former lawyer for Michal Peterson, a novelist living in Durham, North Carolina, who was accused of the murder of his wife, Kathleen. The investigation, case preparation and trial were documented in the series, “The Staircase”, which included an insight into the legal team for Michael Peterson as they met to discuss trial strategy and the testimony of experts. Rudolf will attend the Scottish Criminal Bar Association event to talk about his experiences in the case and take questions.

The event is an opportunity for an unusual insight into this case, one from the perspective of the legal profession. It is an opportunity to consider the legal issues more closely and ask David what it was like to be in the middle of the case.
